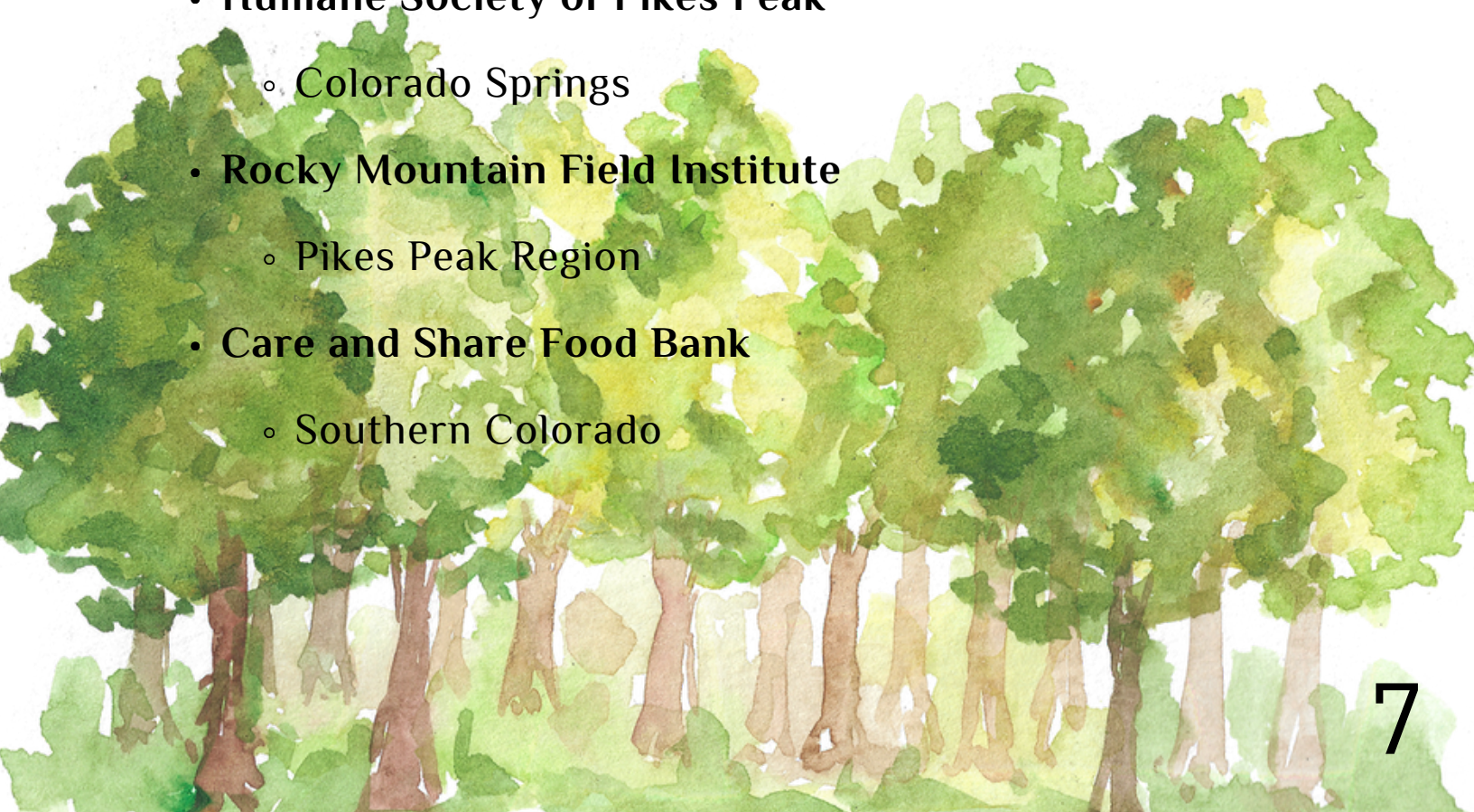

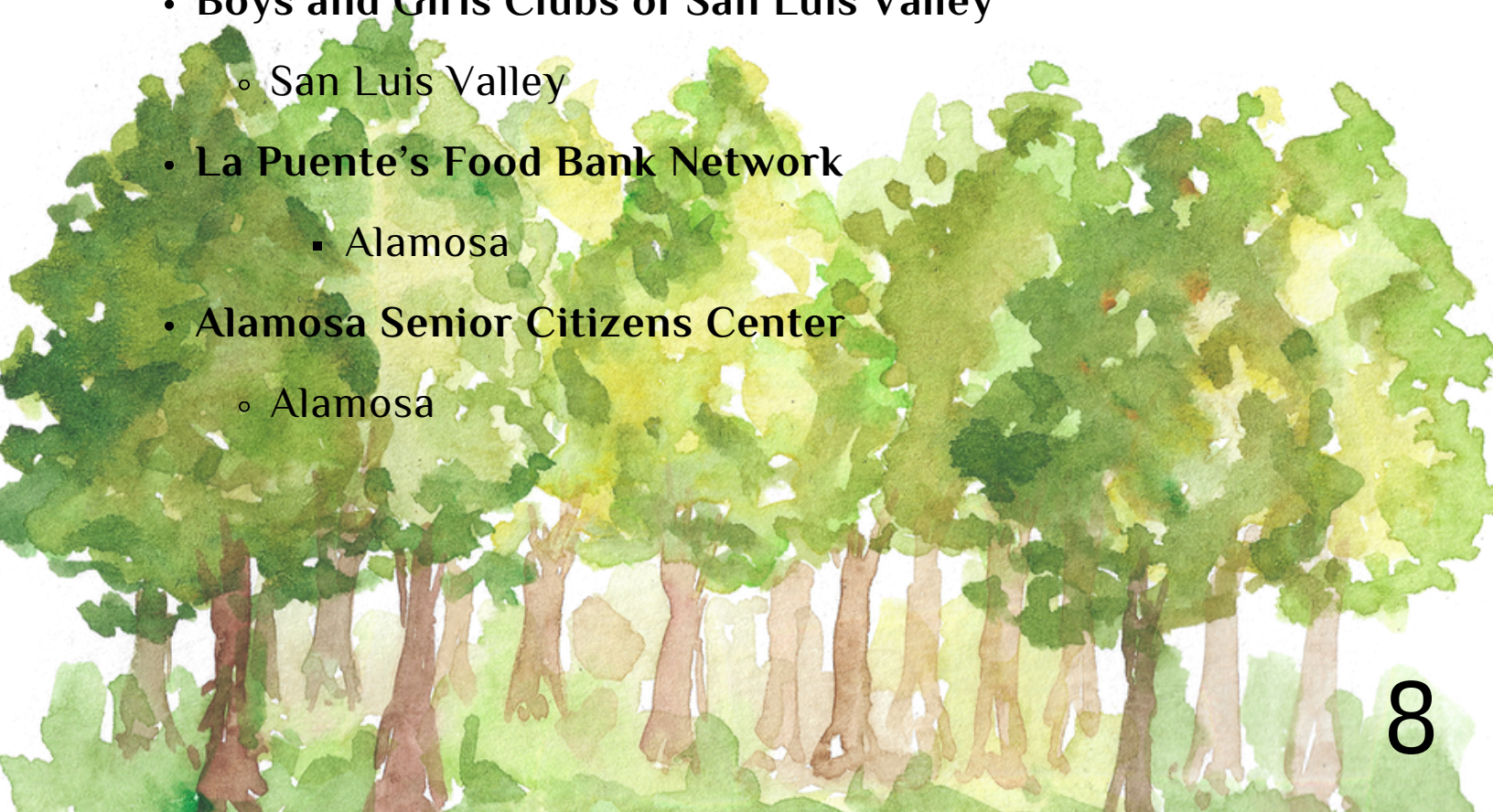

ALL SERVICE INITIATIVES

Colorado FBLA is also supporting our members by developing three service initiatives. The first objective is the statewide Alzheimer's Awareness Challenge, where FBLA members and state officers raise awareness for Alzheimer's disease and dementia. Participants share their videos, nominate others, and encourage donations, with the best challenge video recognized at SLC. The next one is for Colorado FBLA chapters to collectively complete 10,000+ hours of community service. We will have chapters track hours and even recognize the top-performing chapters, promote awards, and share accomplishments online. Lastly, we are creating service toolkits to help chapters and districts with the resources they need to complete service hours. This includes teen-friendly and community nonprofit partners.
